This institution expects its students to maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress as established by this institution. This policy applies to all students enrolled at the school and is applied consistently to all students and programs.

It is printed in the catalog to ensure that all students receive a copy prior to enrollment. The policy complies with the guidelines established by the National Accrediting Commission of Career Arts and Sciences (NACCAS) and the federal regulations established by the United States Department of Education. In order to maintain satisfactory academic progress, the student must meet the following standards:

1. Maintain a cumulative academic average of "C" (70%) or better on all tests, work projects (operations) and other required course work.
2. Maintain a cumulative average attendance level of at least two-thirds (2/3) (67%) of the scheduled hours indicated on their enrollment contract. For example, a student scheduled to complete 30 hours per week would have to maintain an average weekly attendance of at least 20 hours per week ($2/3 \times 30 = 20$). Regardless of the average level of attendance, students who have more than two consecutive weeks of absences (14 calendar days) will be dismissed. This standard shall apply to all students except those on an approved Leave-of-Absence. Students, who expect to be absent 14 days or more and up to 180 days, are encouraged to request a Leave-of-Absence. In addition to attendance standards relating to Satisfactory Academic Progress, students are also required to adhere to certain other general institutional policies relating to attendance and tardiness. These policies are outlined in the "School Rules" section of the catalog.
3. Complete the course within one and one-half (1-1/2) times or 150% of the length of the course as defined in the enrollment agreement.
4. Students must meet minimum academic and attendance requirements for at least one evaluation prior to the midpoint (50%) of the course to be considered as meeting satisfactory progress at the end of an evaluation period. A student will be considered to be making satisfactory progress until the next evaluation.

LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

The school catalogue outlines graduate requirements. These requirements are generated by the Consumer Affairs Act/Rules and Regulations, which establishes the requirements you will need to meet before you complete your course of study. The California State Board of Barbering and Cosmetology mandates an applicant meet the following qualifications to take the licensing exams: be at least 17 years of age, completed the 10th grade in a public school or its equivalency, **committed no acts or crimes constituting grounds for denial of licensure under Section 480 of the Business and Professions Code** and completed the required hours in a Board approved school or completed a 3200 hour apprentice program. 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SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

Safety in the workplace, is emphasized and applied in every practical subject area that you will learn. As your classes are covered and reviewed, you will be made aware of sanitation requirements and disinfecting measures, and the correct method for disposing of certain materials, etc. These safety measures are outlined by the Consumer Affairs. Professionals carry these safety habits into the job sector.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Cosmetologists and Barbers are required to stand for indefinite periods of time. They may be required to perform other movements such as bending, stooping, reaching or lifting light objects. In addition, certain hand, wrist, and arm movements may be necessary.

Manicurists are required to sit on stools at manicuring tables for most of their specialized services. However, some stooping and/or bending is required as pedicure services are done. Industry professionals will work a variety of hours including some holiday periods. Individuals may work weekend shifts, days or evenings as the salon business dictates.

Estheticians are required to stand or sit on stools for indefinite periods of time. Estheticians may be required to perform other movements such as bending, stooping, reaching, or lifting light objects. Certain hand, wrist, and arm movements are necessary.

COMPENSATION

“How much money can I make?” This is a common question that is determined by a variety of factors. Salons have a number of compensation systems that are used. Among the most common systems are salary and/or commissions, commission, or one can work as an independent contractor renting a chair or a booth. Your revenue is based, in part, on how many hours a week you work, your ability to build your clientele, the business opportunity that the salon location provides, and your commitment to your career.

Chain salons, department stores, spas, and the like, generally offer hourly wage and/or commission. Independently owned salons can offer a variety of compensation structures. Newly licensed graduates will want to find a salon that offers the right atmosphere for them, a team atmosphere where there is support and room for career opportunities.

Keep in mind that employers hire in their own image.

Cosmetology - 1000 hours of instruction

Career Description:

(D.O.T. #332.271-010), (CIP #12.0401), (S.O.C. 39-5012): This course covers all phases of cosmetology, skin care, manicuring and pedicuring. Successful completion of this course and successful completion of the California State Board Examination and Licensure will allow the graduate to work in positions such as Hair Stylist, Manicurist, Esthetician, Salon Owner, Make-up Artist and Manufacturer Representative.

Course Outline:

The curriculum for students enrolled in a cosmetology course shall consist of one thousand (1,000) clock hours of technical instruction and practical operations covering all practices constituting the art of cosmetology pursuant to Section 7316 of the Barbering and Cosmetology Act. As part of the 1,000 clock hours, 300 hours will be dedicated to preliminary classroom instruction, also referred to as the freshman curriculum, and 1.25 hours will be dedicated to orientation on the first day of class. Technical instruction means instruction given by demonstration, lecture, classroom participation, or examination. Practical operation shall mean actual performance by the student of a complete service on another person or mannequin. Technical instruction and practical operations shall include:

Successful completion of this course and successful completion of the California State Board Examination and Licensure will allow the graduate to work in positions such as Barber, Stylist, Master Barber, or Barber Shop Operator.

Course Outline: The curriculum for students enrolled in a barbering course shall consist of one thousand (1,000) clock hours of technical instruction and practical training covering all practices of a barber pursuant to Section 7316 of the Barbering and Cosmetology Act. Career Description: (D.O.T. #332.271.014)-(CIP#12.0409), (S.O.C. 39-5094) Students who graduate and pass the State Board examination to receive their Esthetician license are prepared to perform various jobs including waxing, facials, body wraps, make-up and many specialty skin treatments. Employment opportunities include a wide range of specialty areas such as spas, salons, the hospitality industry, cruise ships, patient care, and business ownership.

Course Outline: Students enrolled in the esthetician curriculum at California Hair Design Academy will complete 600 hours of theory, practical training, and technical instruction covering all required practices of esthetics. This includes 250 hours of preliminary classroom instruction in the regulation, science and practice of esthetics, 1.25 hours will be dedicated to orientation followed by 350 hours of applied individual lab, while providing supervised personal client services to complete the minimum number of practical operations. A course in professional development and business management is also taught consisting of training in courtesy, customer service, public relations and professionalism.

Career Description: (CIP #12.0410) (S.O.C. 39-5092) Students who graduate and pass the State Board examination to receive their Manicurist license are prepared to perform various jobs including manicure, pedicure, nail art design, artificial nail application of acrylics and gels. Employment opportunities include a wide range of specialty areas such as nail salons, beauty spas, salons, barbershops, the hospitality industry, cruise ships, patient career, and business ownership.

Course Outline: The curriculum for students enrolled in the Manicurist course requires 400 hours of practical training and technical skills. Emphasizing on the ability of the student to perform all the services normally associated with manicuring, including nail preparation, implements, materials, safety and procedures necessary to meet the requirements of the California State Board Licensing and Regulation and pass the written examination. This includes 80 hours of preliminary classroom instruction in the regulation, science and practice of manicuring, 1.25 hours will be dedicated to orientation followed by 320 hours of applied individual lab, while providing supervised personal client services to complete the minimum number of practical operations. A course in professional development and business management is also taught consisting of training in courtesy, customer service, public relations and professionalism.

 - Financial Aid officers are available at both campuses to assist you.

Step 2: Get FAFSA results from financial aid office

We will call you as soon as your results are in. It may be as quickly as the same day or a few days later. At this time, we will go over what you qualify for and all financial aid options for you.

Step 3: Secure a spot in the class

If you have decided this is definitely the school for you, a \$75 non-refundable registration fee is due to secure a spot in the class. You pay the registration fee when you meet with the financial aid office to finalize your enrollment. This meeting will take approximately one hour, and will be your final meeting with the office before beginning classes. Schedule this appointment ASAP!

Terminology:

Pell Grant: Financial Aid given to you by the federal government to attend school that you do not have to pay back. Pell eligibility is determined by your income.

Unsubsidized Loan: A loan for which the borrower is fully responsible for paying the interest regardless of the loan status. Interest on unsubsidized loans accrues from the date of disbursement **immediately** and continues throughout the life of the loan. Repayment on the principal begins 6 months after graduation.

Subsidized Loan: A loan based on financial need, for which the federal government pays the interest that accrues while the borrower is in an in-school, grace, or deferment status. Repayment on principal begins 6 months **after** graduation.

Parent Plus Loan: A loan in parent's name if credit is approved. Interest begins immediately, and payments on the principal begin shortly afterwards.

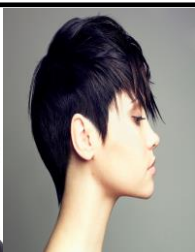
